

When Do Most People Hire a Social Security Lawyer?

Q: If it is not a requirement to have a social security lawyer for a disability case, why should you hire one?

A: Although you are not required to have a social security lawyer in order to file a disability claim, some claimants choose to have one. After being turned down for SSDI benefits after the initial application phase, many claimants decide to have a social security lawyer represent their claims. That is because a large number of claims denied after that first phase will eventually end up being heard by an administrative judge, after being denied again after filing for reconsideration. Statistically, most cases that win in the hearing phase have been represented by a [social security lawyer](#). The advantage of having legal representation by your side is that you know you are following the proper procedures and are providing the best evidence to support your case. You can benefit from a social security lawyer when you initially apply for disability, not just if you reach the hearing phase. Your attorney makes sure you do not miss deadlines and that you have provided all the necessary forms and information. When you hire a social security lawyer, you know you are giving your claim the best chance possible.

Q: Is there a waiting period for submitting a disability application with Social Security?

A: You do not need to wait a certain amount of time before you can apply for social security disability insurance. It takes some claimants a year or more before a final decision is reached regarding their disability claims. That means that your best strategy when you can no longer be employed due to your condition is to apply for disability insurance as soon as possible. If you can still work a little, but your income falls below the minimum amount allowed by Social Security, you should also file for disability. If you believe you qualify for disability, file immediately. If you have any concerns about working a limited amount while filing for disability, it would be helpful to consult a social security lawyer.

Q: What happens if you do not follow the prescriptions given to you by your doctor?

A: Not following prescribed medications can jeopardize your disability claim. The disability examiner for your claim cannot make a fair judgment about the severity of your condition or injury if you are not currently following the prescribed advice given to you by your doctor. Someone reviewing your claim may assume that you are not affected that much by your injury, if you can ignore the advice given by your doctor. If you want a fair judgment made on your claim, take all medications prescribed by your doctor.
