

Car Polish

To minimize scratches on a cars surface, you should use car polish. You should only use car polish after you have washed your car. Both liquid car polish and paste car polish have advantages.

Car polish is applied to the surface of a car to erase scratches and smooth out the finish of the car. You can have car polish done professionally at a body shop or car wash or do it yourself.

Car polish should not be confused with a car cleaner polish. Car cleaner polish is used to remove bug splatter, bird droppings, and minor scratches.

With car polish, the shine of your car is protected for as long as one year.

Car polish should be applied only after you have washed your car. You should work the car polish into only one part of your car at a time. Put a dab of car polish on a clean microsoft cloth and apply in a circular motion. Allow the polish to dry before buffing the area with a new clean microsoft cloth.

Using either paste car polish or liquid car polish will result in the same shine. Paste car polish should only be applied by hand. Because liquid car polish can be applied by machine, you can polish more cars using liquid car polish.
